What instructional activities will be used?

Lesson 4: Students can use the 是 sentence pattern in speech. Students can write some basic characters from this lesson.

Lesson Vocabulary/Phrases: 我, 你, 他, 她, 老师, 学生, 是, 吗, 不, 也, 你呢?, 他呢?/她呢?, 的, 谁

Teach Vocabulary: Quizlet (See below)

Activity A: Have the students practice in pairs or small groups using flashcards with characters and pinyin on one side and English on the other.

Lesson 5: Students can demonstrate understanding of basic rules for writing Chinese characters

Lesson Vocabulary/Phrases: 一, 二, 三, 四, 五, 六, 七, 八, 九, 十, 你好

Teach Vocabulary: Teach the numbers 1 to 10 using the *Number PowerPoint*. Practice the numbers and hand signals with the students. Teach stroke names [Stroke Order Power Point](#). Teach students the forms and names of the basic strokes. **See Stroke Order Video** http://youtu.be/5HFOOiOJN_o

Activity A: Students play the *Stroke Order Game* **See the last few minutes of the Stroke Order video (#3 above)** where students take turns writing the strokes.

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
